(Intermediate: Present Tense "Are you" + "Do you"/ Simple Past Tense)



## FOR GROUPS IN CLASS

- Check if you understand all words, looks words up if needed.
- Write down all questions (see example 1.)
- Then ask different partners questions. If they answer "no", ask another question.
  - If they still answer "no," find another partner.
- If they answer "yes," write down their name (spell, if needed.)
  Ask follow-up questions (Why?) and take notes:
- The first person with answers for all questions wins!

VARIATIONS: Ask one person multiple questions.

Ask multiple people the same questions.

Count "no" answers, but add follow up questions: Why not?

## FOR OUTSIDE OF CLASS **PRACTICE**

Ask friends or family members questions and take notes.

Then write a paragraph about them: Example: " Maria has two children, their names are Max and Claudia. Maria speaks Spanish, a little French and a little English. She is a good cook. Her best dish is chicken soup."
