(Advanced: Present/Past Tense, Present Perfect)



FOR GROUPS IN CLASS

- Check if you understand all words, looks up words if needed.
- Write down all questions (see example 1.)
- Then ask different partners questions. If they answer "no", ask another question.
 - If they still answer "no," find another partner.
- 4. If they answer "yes," write down their name (spell, if needed.)
 5. Ask follow-up questions (Why?) and take notes:
- The first person with answers for all questions wins!

VARIATIONS: Ask one person multiple questions.

Ask multiple people the same questions.

Count "no" answers, but add follow up questions: Why not?
