

# Find someone who...

(Advanced: Present/Past Tense, Present Perfect)



## FOR GROUPS IN CLASS

1. Check if you **understand all words**, looks up words if needed.
2. **Write down all questions** (see example 1.)
3. Then ask different partners questions. If they answer "no", ask another question.  
If they still answer "no," find another partner.
4. If they answer "yes," write down their name (spell, if needed.)
5. Ask follow-up questions (Why?) and **take notes**:
6. The first person with answers for all questions wins!

VARIATIONS: Ask one person multiple questions.

Ask multiple people the same questions.

Count "no" answers, but add follow up questions: Why not?

## FOR OUTSIDE OF CLASS PRACTICE

Ask friends or family members questions and take notes.

Then write a paragraph about them:

**Example:** My sister loves the movie Titanic, she has seen it 5 times. In her free time she likes to swim and to go to the movies. She likes going to Central Park, especially to go iceskating in the winter. ...
